
INSTRUCTIONAL DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

LITERACY EDUCATION

The nationally recognized WVU Literacy Education online master's program prepares students to be certified as **Reading Specialists**, capable of working within the preschool to adult age span. Coursework focuses on preparing specialized literacy professionals in the areas of intervention and assessment, literacy coaching and literacy program coordination, as identified by the International Literacy Association.

This program is completed at only 30 credit hours and is available 100% online, with multiple courses being offered in fall, spring, and summer semesters to allow for flexible scheduling. Students will also have the option to complete their required school-based experiences in the area where they live, supervised remotely by WVU faculty. Program graduates have achieved careers as reading specialists, reading interventionists, classroom teachers, literacy coaches and literacy coordinators.

COUNSELING

The Master of Arts in Counseling program prepares counseling practitioners in clinical mental health counseling and school counseling. The program offers a wide variety of courses to prepare graduates to feel proficient in both individual and group counseling. Students are well prepared to become Licensed Professional Counselors (LPC) in West Virginia and in other states. This program is the only counselor education program accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs (CACREP) in the state of West Virginia.

SCHOOL COUNSELING

This graduate program trains school counselors to work with students with personal and academic concerns. School counselors help students with educational success, interpersonal skills and self-understanding.

CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

This graduate program teaches students many different intervention strategies that can be used in the community or in treatment facilities. Clinical mental health counselors work in many different settings, such as mental health centers, drug treatment centers, prisons, juvenile treatment centers and private practice.

CLINICAL REHABILITATION COUNSELING

Rehabilitation counselors can be found in private practices, in rehabilitation facilities, hospitals, universities, schools, government agencies, insurance companies and other organizations working with people with physical, mental, developmental and emotional disabilities, including veterans. They focus on independent living, employment and/or addressing the personal, social, environmental or psychological issues related to disability.

CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Mental health counselors work with individuals, couples, families and groups to address and treat emotional and mental disorders and to promote mental health. They may work in many different settings, including outpatient and residential mental healthcare centers, substance abuse treatment facilities, individual and family service organizations, local governments and in private practice.

Graduates have been awarded positions as educational psychologists in educational settings; local, state and federal educational agencies; public and private human service centers; medical centers; and business and industrial settings.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILY STUDIES

This major prepares students to work with children, adolescents or families in educational, applied or other clinical settings. Graduates have been hired as directors of child care programs in corporations, hospitals and the private sector, or as specialists in parenting and curriculum development for Head Start and similar agencies. Elementary and secondary educators also have used their master's degree in CDFS to broaden the scope of their teaching in their classrooms.

INCOMING FRESHMEN

3.0 GPA and at least one of the following:

- 26 ACT
- Math and Critical Reading SAT score total of 1170 (pre-March 2016 test sitting)
- Evidence Based Reading/Writing and Math Section total of 1240 (post-March 2016 test sitting)
- Passing scores on all three sections of the Praxis CORE test

PRE-ELEMENTARY EDUCATION ADMISSION

If you do not meet the direct admission requirements, above, you can begin coursework as a Pre-Elementary Education student, if you meet the following requirements.

2.75 GPA and at least one of the following:

- 22 ACT
- Math and Critical Reading SAT score total of 1040 (pre-March 2016 test sitting)
- Evidence Based Reading/Writing and Math Section total of 1110 (post-March 2016 test sitting)

TRANSFER STUDENTS

A 2.75 college GPA and at least one of the above ACT, SAT or Praxis CORE testing requirements must be met.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

High School Graduates

Students must have graduated from high school at least four years prior to applying to the program.

GED Students

Students who have passed a high school equivalency examination are eligible for admission, four years after their high school class graduated.

Transfer Students

Students may transfer into the RBA program from other institutions, or from other majors within WVU, if they are eligible.

F-forgiveness Policy

This policy allows students to have all failing grades earned at least four years prior to joining the RBA program to be removed from GPA calculations.
